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Guideline Goals and Objectives:

- To improve early detection of lung cancer, resulting in improved patient outcomes, patient experience and quality of care provided.
- To provide an accessible guideline that will result in increased reliable and consistent care provincially.
- The ease of availability of practical evidence based oncology information, prepared by subject matter experts and family physicians, for use during patient consults throughout BC, will enhance the patient’s experience and the level of care provided. The standards of care promoted through this guideline will also encourage the most effective and efficient care for cancer patients and their families. To ensure usability, the guideline will include additional features such as: use of visuals; patient care pathways delineating the process of referral, shared care, transitions of care, advance care planning; and patient handouts.

- Development of the guideline will follow the best practices as established by the Doctors of BC and Ministry of Health. This guideline will be developed in partnership with the Guidelines and Protocols Advisory Committee (GPAC), BC Cancer Population Oncology and with BC Cancer's Provincial Primary Care Program/Family Practice Oncology Network taking the lead. BC Cancer Population Oncology is working with the Ministry of Health to develop a High Risk Lung Cancer Screening Protocol, and this will be included as part of the broader primary care guideline when available.
